RCRSG and how to contact us

Roseburn Cycle Route Support Group (RCRSG) is a community group campaigning for high quality cycling infrastructure in the Roseburn Area. Membership is open to anyone over 16 who agrees with our aims. Members join via our website at www.roseburncycleroute.org.uk.

What information do we collect?

We collect the following data for each of our members.

- User name
- Email address
- Reason member would benefit from cycle paths in the area (e.g. live in, work in or travel through Roseburn).
- Statement of agreement with group aims.

How do we use, store and secure personal information?

We use the information collected to send a newsletter to all subscribed members. We analyse anonymised data about our membership for the purposes of informing the City of Edinburgh Council and other bodies about the composition of our membership.

Through acceptance of this privacy policy, our members consent to the use of their data as outlined above.

If at any point you wish to withdraw your consent for your personal information to be held by us, please <u>contact us</u> and we will delete your data and terminate your membership. A member may choose to unsubscribe from the newsletter, but their personal information will be retained.

When do we share personal data?

We never share personal data outside of the RCRSG. Anonymised data about the number of members and how they would benefit from cycling infrastructure in Roseburn may be shared with other organisations.
